## SERIES NOTES

- Indiana leads the all-time series, 18-15.
- Seattle's last win vs. Indiana came on June 12, 2016, as Jewell Loyd netted two free throws with 2.4 seconds left to lift the Storm to a 90-88 victory. Seattle had to overcome an 11-point deficit with only three minutes remaining.
- In the last meeting, Breanna Stewart posted one of her two 30-point efforts of her rookie campaign, as she tallied 32 points on 11-for-15 shooting to go along with 11 rebounds.

## 2016 RESULTS VS. INDIANA

Seattle 82, Indiana 93 - KeyArena, Seattle, Wash. (7/10/16)

Rookie forward Breanna Stewart recorded 32 points, 11 rebounds and five assists, but the Seattle Storm lost 93-82 to the Indiana Fever at KeyArena on Sunday. In its fourth game in six days, the Storm took control in the second quarter, outscoring the Fever 32-19 to take a lead into halftime. Stewart shot 11-for-15 Sunday night, including 4-for-5 from three-point range en route to her 32 points. It was the second 30-point game of the season and eighth double-double for the two-time Rookie of the Month. Alysha Clark added 11 points, while Jewell Loyd and Ramu Tokashiki scored 10 apiece. Catchings had five quick points to start the game, coming on a three-pointer and a pair of free throws, as part of an 11-2 start for the Fever. Indiana would maintain a comfortable edge for most of the quarter, but reserves Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis and Tokashiki scored five and six points in the period, respectively, to keep Seattle within striking distance. Indiana pounded the ball inside for seven early points from Erlana Larkins. The Storm was on fire from three-point range to start the second quarter, including a pair of treys from Stewart, and tied the game at 27 after a 9-2 run. Seattle then took its first lead on a Langhorne free throw midway through the frame. Stewart again connected from three-point range late in the quarter, and the Storm took control with another huge run to take a 50-44 lead at the break. Stewart scored 16 points in the second quarter alone, including a trio of three-pointers. The Fever regained the lead quickly in the second half, as Erica Wheeler hit a pair of jumpers on an 11-2 spurt to start the third quarter. Tiffany Mitchell came off the bench and scored eight points in the third, while Stewart continued to dominate on the offensive end for Seattle. Stewart hit her fourth three-pointer to cut Indiana's lead to 69-66 heading into the final period. Indiana had another hot start to the quarter, this time starting the fourth on a 9-2 run capped off by a Johnson three-pointer that made it a double-digit advantage. Seattle had just two points in the first 4:40 of the quarter, and the Fever proceeded to extend its lead to as many as 16 despite Stewart continuing to have her way.

Seattle 90, Indiana, 88 - Bankers Life Fieldhouse, Indianapolis, Ind. (6/12/16)

Jewell Loyd scored 16 points in the second half, including the go-ahead free throws with 2.4 seconds remaining, to guide Seattle to a 90-88 win over the Indiana Fever. The Storm was ahead for the entire game until the final minute, and it held a commanding 82-71 lead with three minutes to play. But the Fever came back from what was once a 17-point deficit, and Tiffany Mitchell made a layup with 31 seconds on the clock to give Indiana its first lead of the night. Loyd, responded with a midrange jump shot just eight seconds later to put the Storm in front 88-87. Loyd was fouled while attempting a shot from the right baseline on the ensuing fast break, and she drained both free throws to put Seattle ahead 90-88. The Fever wasn't able to get another shot off, and the Storm earned its second road victory of the season. After scoring a combined 12 points on 3-16 shooting in her previous two outings, Loyd recorded her fifth 20-point game of the season on Sunday. Storm forward Crystal Langhorne had 17 points and Sue Bird finished with 16. Indiana forward Tamika Catchings, playing her final home game against the Storm before she retires after the season, notched a game-high 27. Seattle's victory snapped a five-game losing streak against Indiana, which hadn't lost to the Storm at home since 2008. The two teams are now tied at sixth in the WNBA standings with 4-6 records. Seattle jumped out to a 13-3 lead in the opening minutes and would increase its edge to 17 by the end of the period after knocking down four three-pointers and forcing Indiana into eight first-quarter turnovers. Seattle led by just six at halftime, as the Fever outscored the Storm 24-13 in the second quarter. Bird guided the Storm to a strong start in the second half, as Seattle would push its lead back to double digits and take a 66-54 edge into the fourth quarter. Loyd also scored eight of her 20 points in the third period. Reserve Jenna O'Hea hit a pair of three-pointers in the fourth quarter to help the Storm hold off a furious comeback by the Fever. O'Hea finished with 10 points, and the Storm got further contributions off the bench in six points by Ramu Tokashiki and five from Monica Wright. The Storm held Mitchell, Indiana's leading scorer, to just nine points on 2-of-9 shooting. It was just the second time this year that Mitchell has failed to reach double figures.

Seattle 75, Indiana 85 - Bankers Trust Fieldhouse, Indianapolis, Ind. (6/1/16)

The Seattle Storm fell 85-75 to the Indiana Fever on Wednesday at Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The Storm drops to 2-4 on the season, while Indiana (3-3) jumps ahead of Seattle in the WNBA standings by snapping its two-game losing streak. Rookie forward Breanna Stewart paced the Storm with a game-high 22 points, including 16 in the second half. Stewart passed 100 career points late in the fourth quarter and has now scored 20 or more in three of her six games. Fellow first-year player Tiffany Mitchell recorded 19 for the Fever, and reserve Lynetta Kizer led Indiana with 20 points on 8-of-13 shooting. Seattle was without starting forward Alysha Clark, who made the trip but was inactive with a right knee bruise. Jenna O'Hea made her first start of the season, scoring six points in 25 minutes. Indiana built its lead on Wednesday through a dominant first half. The Storm scored the first seven points of the game, but Indiana responded by draining a couple of three-pointers during an 18-7 run that led to a four-point lead at the end of the first quarter. Seattle shot efficiently from the field throughout the first half, but eight turnovers in the opening quarter and four giveaways in the second caused the Storm to fall behind. The Storm finished 53.8 percent from the field for the night, but 20 total turnovers compared to 14 for Indiana made the difference. Despite six first-half assists by Sue Bird, Indiana was ahead 51-38 at half-time behind 13 points from Mitchell. The Fever finished the half on an 11-1 run after Seattle had cut the lead to three at 40-37 at the 2:45 mark. In the first half, Seattle converted just two of its eight three-point attempts, while Indiana sank a trio of shots from beyond the arc on just four attempts. The Storm ended with a three-point percentage of 27.8 (5-for-18) on Wednesday, while Indiana finished 6-of-13 from long distance. The Storm committed turnovers on each of its first three possessions of the second half, allowing Indiana to increase its lead to as many as 21 in the third quarter. Seattle gradually cut into the deficit in the final period behind a late surge from Stewart, but it wasn't enough to overcome the Fever on the road. Bird added 14 points and six assists on Wednesday, while Jewell Loyd notched 11 points and four rebounds. Rookie guard Blake Dietrick made her WNBA debut, checking in late in the fourth quarter and recording four minutes of action.

## LAST GAME

Seattle 68, Los Angeles 78 - Staples Center (5/13/17)

Despite shooting 52 percent from the field, Seattle couldn't overcome 23 turnovers in a 78-68 setback to Los Angeles in its season opener on Saturday afternoon at the STAPLES Center. The Sparks turned those miscues into 29 points, as Nneka Ogumike led the way with 23 points on 10-for-20 shooting. Jewell Loyd paced the Storm with a game-high 25 points, four dimes and four rebounds, while Ramu Tokashiki and Crystal Langhorne added 14 and 13 points, respectively. While Candace Parker and Jantel Lavender were missing in action for Los Angeles, the Storm played without Sue Bird and Breanna Stewart, and head coach Jenny Boucek applauded the team for its toughness. Trailing 9-8 in the first quarter, Loyd knocked down a triple to spark a 13-10 run to cap the quarter, as Seattle (0-1) connected on eight of its last 10 shots of the frame to take a one-point (21-20) lead. Loyd and Langhorne combined for 17 points in the quarter on eight-for-11 shooting, and the Storm also posted eight first-quarter assists. To open the second frame, Ramu Tokashiki netted two free throws before Noelle Quinn's extra pass found Sami Whitcomb in the left corner for the triple to extend Seattle's advantage to six (26-20). The Sparks responded with six unanswered points before Tokashiki and Loyd knocked down midrange jumpers to put the Storm back up by four (30-26). Seattle had trouble taking care of the ball, and Ogumike buried two three's amidst a 10-0 Sparks run to put Los Angeles on top, 36-30. But Loyd continued to keep the Storm close, scoring seven of the last nine to pull Seattle to within one (38-37) at the half. With the game tied at 47 apiece, the Sparks capped the third stanza with a 7-2 run, as Ogumike nailed a jumper in the final seconds of the quarter. Los Angeles (1-0) scored five quick points to open the fourth and stretch its lead to 10 (59-49), but Seattle responded with a 9-2 run to pull within three (59-56) after a jumper by Tokashiki. After Los Angeles went back up by seven (65-58), Quinn knocked down a three before Langhorne notched a three-point play the old fashioned way to cut the deficit to three (67-64). Chelsea Gray fired back with a three in the corner, and then Ogumike scored twice inside to start a 9-2 Sparks run to seal it for Los Angeles.

## PREVIOUS GAME

Seattle 55, Phoenix 72 - Talking Stick Resort Arena (5/7/17)

Early turnovers and a rough day from the field plagued the Seattle Storm in its preseason finale, as the team dropped a 72-55 decision to the Phoenix Mercury on Sunday evening at Talking Stick Resort Arena. Phoenix evened the all-time preseason series with Seattle at five games apiece, as Stephanie Talbot and Cayla George shared game-high honors with 16 points apiece. Seattle got off to a rocky start, missing its first four shots and committing five turnovers to fall behind by nine (13-4) in the first quarter. Meanwhile, Phoenix shot lights out in its preseason home opener, shooting 69.2 percent (9-for-13) and draining five early three's to take a 25-13 advantage into the second stanza. Things didn't get much better in the second quarter, as the Mercury surged to a 19-point (36-17) lead after Danielle Robinson knocked down a floater. Sami Whitcomb drained Seattle's first trey of the game to bridge the gap to 14 (36-22) at the 3:37 mark, but Phoenix ultimately took a 46-29 advantage into the locker room. The Storm shot just 34.8 percent (8-for-23) in the opening 20 minutes, compared to a 57.1 clip (16-for-28) by the Mercury. Much of the Mercury damage in the first half came by the way of Talbot, who scored 14 first-half points on a perfect 5-for-5 effort from the field, including three triples. In the third frame, rookie guard Alexis Peterson finished in the paint to cut the deficit to 15 (46-31), but the Storm never got closer for the rest of the way. Camille Little scored inside to kickstart a 17-8 Mercury run to stretch the lead to 24 (63-39), and the Storm's shooting woes continued with a 6-for-19 third-quarter clip. Phoenix swelled its lead to as many as 25 (72-47) with 6:03 left to play after Yvonne Turner netted two freebees at the line, and the Storm mustered an 8-0 run before the final buzzer sounded. Jewell Loyd led Seattle with 13 points and five boards, while Whitcomb came off the bench to drill three triples on the way to scoring 12 points. In addition, Jenna O'Hea dished out a team-high four assists.

## LAST GAME VS. TONIGHT'S OPPONENT

Seattle 82, Indiana 93 - KeyArena, Seattle, Wash. (7/10/16)

Rookie forward Breanna Stewart recorded 32 points, 11 rebounds and five assists, but the Seattle Storm lost 93-82 to the Indiana Fever at KeyArena on Sunday in its fourth game in six days, the Storm took control in the second quarter, outscoring the Fever 32-19 to take a lead into halftime. Stewart shot 11-for-15 Sunday night, including 4-for-5 from three-point range en route to her 32 points. It was the second 30-point game of the season and eighth double-double for the two-time Rookie of the Month. Alysha Clark added 11 points, while Jewell Loyd and Ramu Tokashiki scored 10 apiece. Catchings had five quick points to start the game, coming on a three-pointer and a pair of free throws, as part of an 11-2 start for the Fever. Indiana would maintain a comfortable edge for most of the quarter, but reserves Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis and Tokashiki scored five and six points in the period, respectively, to keep Seattle within striking distance. Indiana pounded the ball inside for seven early points from Erlana Larkins. The Storm was on fire from three-point range to start the second quarter, including a pair of treys from Stewart, and tied the game at 27 after a 9-2 run. Seattle then took its first lead on a Langhorne free throw midway through the frame. Stewart again connected from three-point range late in the quarter, and the Storm took control with another huge run to take a 50-44 lead at the break. Stewart scored 16 points in the second quarter alone, including a trio of three-pointers. The Fever regained the lead quickly in the second half, as Erica Wheeler hit a pair of jumpers on an 11-2 spurt to start the third quarter. Tiffany Mitchell came off the bench and scored eight points in the third, while Stewart continued to dominate on the offensive end for Seattle. Stewart hit her fourth three-pointer to cut Indiana's lead to 69-66 heading into the final period. Indiana had another hot start to the quarter, this time starting the fourth on a 9-2 run capped off by a Johnson three-pointer that made it a double-digit advantage. Seattle had just two points in the first 4:40 of the quarter, and the Fever proceeded to extend its lead to as many as 16 despite Stewart continuing to have her way.

## PLAYER NOTES

### PETERSON, MONTGOMERY HEAD WEST

In the 2017 WNBA Draft presented by State Farm, the Storm selected Alexis Peterson (15th pick, Syracuse) in the second round, followed by Lanay Montgomery (30th pick, West Virginia) in the third round. The all-time assist leader at Syracuse and reigning ACC Player of the Year, Peterson served as the floor general for the Orange, totaling 1,978 points and 590 assists to cap her career. Montgomery, a 6-5 center, averaged 10.6 points, 8.9 boards and 2.8 blocks per game in 2016-17 on the way to leading the Mountaineers to their first Big 12 Tournament title.

### ANYTHING YOU CAN DO...

Breanna Stewart notched 2016 WNBA Rookie of the Year honors to cap her inaugural professional campaign and help Seattle become the first franchise in league history to garner back-to-back Rookie of the Year honorees (Jewell Loyd, 2015). In addition to posting 12 double-doubles, Stewart averaged a team-high 18.3 points and 9.3 rebounds to carry the Storm to its first playoff appearance since 2013.

### BACK FOR SECONDS

In 2016, Breanna Stewart simply shattered the Storm's all-time rookie records, and the New York native is poised to carry the momentum over to her sophomore campaign. The reigning WNBA Rookie of the Year and All-WNBA Second Team selection, Stewart set Storm rookie records for points (621), field goals (208), rebounds (317) and minutes (1,179), and she also tied the single-season block record with 64. Stewart scored 20+ points in 15 games, including a historic, single-record tally of 38 vs. Atlanta on June 28, 2016.

### SEATTLE ADDS A SWORD(S)

Seattle's frontline got a lot taller in late January thanks to the acquisition of 6-6 center Carolyn Swords. The Storm traded its sixth and 18th picks in the 2017 WNBA Draft with Washington to get the Boston College graduate out to Seattle. The Mystics, as part of the three-way swap, sent Kia Vaughn and Bria Hartley to New York. In her final season with the Liberty, Swords averaged a career-best 5.2 points and 4.6 rebounds per game while shooting 57 percent from the floor.

### BIRD: RECORD WATCHING

Entering the 2017 campaign, Sue Bird sits only 19 steals away from reaching 600, as well as 477 points from becoming the eighth player in WNBA history to eclipse the 6,000-point total. The 36-year-old is the oldest active player in the league, and in her 16th season with the Storm, Bird needs only 189 more dimes to pass Ticha Penicheiro as the WNBA's career assist leader.

### ONE OF THE ALL-TIME BEST DISHIN' THE ROCK

Sue Bird is just 188 assists shy of tying Ticha Penicheiro (2,599) on the WNBA all-time assist rankings. She boasts a 5.4 assist per game career average, sitting in second place on the all-time list. Bird led the league in dimes per game in 2016, dishing out 5.8 en route to the WNBA Peak Performer award in the category.

### SHE'S A THIEF

Now in her 16th season in the WNBA, Sue Bird is eighth in career steals with 581. She averages 1.3 steals per game for her career, which included one season missed due to injury. In eight of the 14 years she played, Bird recorded 1.4 or more steals per contest. Her 579 career steals rank fourth among active players, and there's a good chance she moves up on the all-time list this year.

### A SHINY, NEW JEWELL

Jewell Loyd's jump from her rookie campaign to year two in the WNBA paid dividends in Seattle's late-season push for its 11th playoff appearance in franchise history. Loyd's points-per-game average jumped 5.8 points (from 10.7 to 16.5), and she also nearly doubled her assist average to 3.4 per contest in 2016. Loyd's game-winner at Phoenix snapped a nine-game losing streak to the Mercury and gave Seattle its first win of the 2016 season, and she later netted a career-high 32 points in a 14-point win over the Mercury on June 3, 2016.

### HOME, SWEET HOME

On Feb. 8, 2017, Seattle inked sharpshooter Sami Whitcomb to its training camp roster, allowing the former University of Washington standout to return to Seattle. With five years of international experience, Whitcomb has most recently played for the Perth Lynx in Australia, where she totaled 24.0 points, 5.4 rebounds and two assists per game. While playing for the Huskies during her college career, Whitcomb led the team in scoring (13.0 PPG), rebounds (5.6 RPG) and assists (2.5 APG).

### STORM TRIO COLLECTS POSTSEASON AWARDS

Seattle boasted the most players on the 2016 All-WNBA First and Second Teams, highlighted by Sue Bird's first team recognition and recipient of the Peak Performer Award as the league leader in assists (5.8 per game). Breanna Stewart (18.3 PPG, 9.3 RPG) was named the 2016 Rookie of the Year, and both she and Jewell Loyd (16.5 PPG, 3.4 APG) earned second team recognition. Together, the trio accounted for nearly 59 percent of the team's offense and 66 percent of its team assists.

### SCOUTING REPORT

Crystal Langhorne sits in second all-time on the WNBA's FG% charts. A career 56.4% shooter, Langhorne has led the Storm in scoring twice since joining the team and in consecutive seasons (2014, 2015).

## PLAYER NOTES

### MOVIN' ON UP

With a 5-for-7 effort from the field at Los Angeles on May 13, 2017, Crystal Langhorne moved to No. 2 all-time in the WNBA in field goal percentage, as she surpassed Nneka Ogumwike, who coincidentally guarded her for most of the game. Langhorne has made 56.4 (1505-2667) of her field goals and has shot 57 percent or higher for the season in five of the nine campaigns she has been a part of. In 2016, Langhorne led Seattle with a blistering 63 percent clip. In addition to climbing the WNBA record books, she also eclipsed the 1,400-defensive rebound club, as she pulled down six at Los Angeles to bump her career total to 1,401.

### FOURTH TIME'S A CHARM

For the fourth time in her career, Jewell Loyd netted at least 15 first-half points, as she posted 18 in the first half at Los Angeles on May 13, 2017. Loyd finished the contest with a game-high 25 points on 10-for-18 shooting, and she registered 13 20-point games last season, which ties for sixth all-time in franchise history. On June 3, 2016, she scored 19 in the first half vs. Phoenix en route to a career-high 32.

### REACHING 25

In the season opener at Los Angeles on May 13, 2017, Jewell Loyd booked her seventh-career game with 25 or more points. In 33 minutes of action, she scored a game-high 25 points on 10-for-18 shooting, including two jumpers from downtown. Loyd is no stranger to success at the STAPLES Center, as she tallied 20 points in the team's season opener at Los Angeles a year ago. She has simply been lights out from the field during her career, connecting on over 42 percent of her field goals and nearly 90 percent of her free throws.

### THERE'S A FIRST FOR EVERYTHING

Seattle is facing Indiana in its home opener for the first time in franchise history. The two teams met three times in 2016, with the Fever taking the series by a 2-1 margin. While Indiana owns the all-time series, 18-15, the Storm has been successful at home with an 11-5 mark. In its lone matchup at KeyArena last year, Seattle dropped a 93-82 setback. Despite the loss, Breanna Stewart recorded 32 points to book just the third 30-point rookie performance in franchise history.

### REACHING NEW HEIGHTS

The Storm's 86 total points in the preseason opener vs. Phoenix set a franchise record for the most points tallied in a preseason game. After leading by only eight (39-31) at halftime, Seattle shot 51.3 percent (20-for-39) in the second half and outscored the Mercury by 14 in the final 20 minutes to seal an 86-64 victory. The home team was simply en fuego at the charity stripe with a 16-for-16 effort, and the Storm also won the rebounding battle, 37-25. Seattle improved to 19-25 in preseason games, including a 12-9 mark at KeyArena.

### STORM AT NO. 5 IN FIRST AP POWER POLL

The Associated Press (AP) released its preseason WNBA poll, and the Storm garnered a fifth-place ranking with 132 points. Last season, Seattle was ranked ninth entering the season.

### STORM SPLITS WITH MERCURY IN PRESEASON

The Storm split its 2017 preseason slate with the Phoenix Mercury, notching a 22-point (86-64) win in Seattle on May 3 before dropping a 17-point (72-55) decision on the road over the weekend. Jewell Loyd led Seattle offensively, averaging 13.5 points and shooting a perfect 10-for-10 from the free throw line. Adding a spark off the bench, Sami Whitcomb netted 27 total points in the two games combined, including a 6-for-14 effort from downtown.

### ROAD WARRIORS

Although five of Seattle's first six games in 2017 will take place inside the friendly confines of KeyArena, the Storm will face a brutal road slate in August that covers 21,374 miles across six road contests in five different states. Last season, the Storm dropped 10 of 13 road games before fighting back to win three of its last five.

### HOT FINISH TO 2016

The Storm won five of its last six to cap the regular season in 2016 and earn the No. 7 seed in the WNBA Playoffs. Three of those triumphs came on the road, and Seattle won those five games by an average of 13.8 points. In Seattle's second to last home game, the Storm took down soon-to-be WNBA champion Los Angeles by an 18-point (78-60) margin, as Breanna Stewart led the way with her 15th 20+ point effort of the season.

## JENNY BOUCEK BIOGRAPHY

### JENNY BOUCEK

On Jan. 20, 2015, Jenny Boucek was named the fourth head coach in the history of the Seattle Storm and immediately set about rebuilding the team. In her two seasons at the helm, she coached consecutive WNBA Rookie of the Year winners in Jewell Loyd (2015) and Breanna Stewart (2016). Following a 10-24 campaign in 2015 with a roster that featured three rookies, Boucek's 2016 Storm improved to 16-18 for the franchise's first 15+ win season and playoff berth since 2013. Immediately prior to becoming the team's head coach, she spent four seasons with the Storm under then-head coach Brian Agler, rejoining the defending WNBA champions in 2010 as Dir. of Player Development and Scouting. She was promoted to associate head coach in 2014.

Boucek has been involved in the WNBA since it's inaugural season, suiting up for the Cleveland Rockers in 1997. Following a career-ending injury in 1998, she began her WNBA coaching career as an assistant with the Washington Mystics in 1999. She then spent three seasons, 2000-02, in the same capacity with the Miami Sol. Boucek enjoyed her first stint in Seattle on Anne Donovan's staff from 2003-05, a span which included the franchise's first WNBA Championship in 2004. Her first stop as a WNBA head coach came in Sacramento, leading the now-defunct Sacramento Monarchs to a 40-41 clip over two-plus seasons, spanning 2007-09.

Notably respected as one of the top coaches in the league, Boucek has spent much of her career as a student of the game. She served as an advanced scout with the Seattle SuperSonics, and more recently, had full access to Dallas Mavericks Head Coach Rick Carlisle's training camp in September and October of 2014. She was involved in all coaches meetings, film and practice sessions and player meetings.

Boucek also played in Iceland in 1998 and was voted the country's best player after averaging 23 points, seven rebounds and six assists. She returned to Cleveland for the 1998 season but was forced to retire due to a career-ending back injury.

A four-year starter at the University of Virginia (1992-96), Boucek helped lead the Cavaliers to four regular-season ACC Championships and three NCAA Elite Eight appearances. She was a two-time GTE Academic All-American team member and two-time ACC selection. Boucek twice earned team Defensive Player of the Year honors and finished her career at Virginia as a member of the 1,000-point club.

She also competed in the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993.
